Tuggerah Public School Behaviour Support and Management Plan

Overview

At Tuggerah Public School we want every student to feel welcomed and included in all parts of school life. Inclusive, engaging and respectful learning environments play a critical role in supporting students reach their full potential. The positive partnerships between staff, parents, carers, service providers and community is paramount to managing inclusive, safe behaviour that improves children's mental health and wellbeing.

We acknowledge that respectful relationships and a sense of belonging, promote social and emotional learning. Students need to be active participants and all response strategies need to be student focused and strength based where diversity is respected and valued.

Tuggerah Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are:

Student Interest Clubs - peer support, Stage Gender Advisors, MacqLit, MiniLit, Quiksmart, Structured -tiered playground, Worry Woos, Cool Connections, Seasons for Growth, Wellbeing Journals, Second Steps- Social Emotional Learning, Student Playground Mentors, Peer mediation, Structured play and social skills groups. Anti Bullying & Cybersafety programs, Interrelate Sexuality Education, Cultural connections- Aboriginal, Dance, Didge, Choir, Art and Dhinewan Mentoring K-6, Djembe Drumming, project-based learning, peer leadership- Children's University, tech crew & photographers, learning to lead, GRIP leadership.

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Tuggerah Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

- To **respect** yourself and others
- To be **responsible** for your actions
- To demonstrate resilience
- To strive for excellence



Tuggerah Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

Students will be rewarded both in the playground and classrooms for making positive behaviour choices.

Class Gurandi Charts are utilised for monitoring weekly progress.

When students demonstrate the above core values and over 10, 20, 30 and 40 weeks they will contribute towards **Gurandi Awards** of Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum certificates and badges. The Platinum Awards will be presented at Assemblies.

A **KidsMatter Certificate** with prizes such as engraved wrist bands, drink bottles and handballs are also presented at each assembly for outstanding citizenship and consistent demonstration of all four core values.

All students' names are published in the school newsletter for all the above awards.

"Thumbs up" are utilised as frequent rewards for reinforcing matrix explicit behaviours. At Friday recess assemblies, ten students' names are drawn out of a barrel. These students then spin the Tuggerah Public School Spinning Wheel with a chance of winning many exciting prizes.

Physical Violence social story (remaining 6 on matrix to be designed by students) utilised in every classroom.

Gurandi Kookaburra mascot present at all whole school events – carnivals, Day On The Green, Harmony Day, Bullying No Wat Day.
